
## **Key Drivers – Future Impact Score**

#### **Transformative and Connected**

Jasper proactively leans into building strong regional partnerships to strengthen its role as a regional hub. There is a robust focus is on strategic investments in technology, diversified industries, and housing diversity.



#### **Steady and Traditional**

The community prefers continuity and tradition, with key institutions focused on maintaining stability and familiar values. There is a deliberate approach of adapting gradually, with an aim of maintaining Jasper's strong sense of legacy and identity.

## **Scenario Characteristics - Dimensions to Consider**

#### **Community and Social Fabric Characteristics**

- Population makeup / demographics
- Key social infrastructure housing, childcare, schools, parks, amenities
- Community safety and wellness
- Workforce and skills profiles, workplace models and opportunity
- Community vitality and celebration of history; arts and culture feel and 'vibe'
- Community inclusiveness and values
- Downtown core/Main Street and architectural assets
- Role of educational institutions and models of education

#### **Economic and Built Environment Characteristics**

- Businesses and industry sectors (retail, education, health, technology, recreation, tourism)
- Type and size of industries in Jasper
- Hard infrastructure (roads, water, transport, utilities)
- Development patterns in the community
- Level of innovation and investment
- Regional appeal and competitiveness
- Small business ecosystem

#### **Environmental and Landscape Characteristics**

- Housing types and affordability
- Neighborhood character
- Transportation, mobility, and geographic location
- Natural resource usage
- Adaptation to climate change / severe weather events
- Streetscapes, parks, green spaces, and recreation amenities
- Energy systems and sources
- Key buildings and assets what's being preserved, uplifted, catalyzed on

## Avoiding potential pitfalls.....

- Stay in your swim lane (your scenario)
- Don't try to 'fix' the scenario
- We are doing objective forecasting and predictive don't get emotionally hooked
- We are exploring possible futures; not deciding on preference
- Scan and predict widely don't get micro-focused
- Make it a group discussion, everyone has a perspective to contribute







## **Breakout Session Roles**

Each Scenario Group must include the following roles:

- Facilitator: Each breakout group will have one or two assigned facilitators who help moderate the
  conversation and encourage participation.
- **Timekeeper:** The Timekeeper helps keep the breakout group on track using the provided schedule to make sure that the group gets through the full activity.
- Recorders: The Recorder(s) is responsible for taking notes for the breakout group using the provided worksheets.
- **Presenter(s):** 1 or 2 Presenter(s) will share back key takeaways to the larger Think-Tank group at the end of the Breakout Session.
- **Participants:** Everyone in the breakout group is encouraged to share insights and perspectives. Active participation means a wide variety of voices and more meaningful conversations.

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


# Jasper Comprehensive Plan Expected, Preferred and Least Desirable Futures Heatmaps

Expected, Preferred and Least Desirables of the Future – What do you think?

- 1. **LEAST DESIRABLE FUTURE** The Least Desirable Future is the future that you think will be most undesirable (or least optimal or least desired) future in 2040.
- 2. **EXPECTED FUTURE**: The Expected Future is the future you expect most likely to eventuate by 2040, if existing trends and trajectory persists.
- 3. PREFERRED FUTURE: The Preferred Future is the future you think is optimal and creates the best outcome for Jasper in 2040.
